What is ISC?

- the only intergovernmental organization for the development of sericulture & silk industry across the globe
- Officially institutionalized on 6th August, 1960
- Registered with United Nations - Reg.No.10418
- > Strength





the legacy of ISC

- First International Congress on Sericulture at Goritez, Italy
- Rich legacy since 1870
- Louis Pasteur attended subsequent Congresses in 1871 and 1872 in Italy and Switzerland
- Sir Pasteur identified techniques to eradicate Pebrine and presented his papers
- 7th Congress in Ales in 1948 declared organized global development of silk industry
- To fulfil that aim, the idea of International Sericultural Commission adopted by countries
- Signing of an International treaty in 1957
- Institutionalization on 8th August 1960


